Peg's Ponderings: Got News?

Have you ever heard of a public transit bus driver stopping his bus to give his shoes to a man he sees walking barefoot in 40-degree temperature? Amazing, isn't it? This really did happen in downtown Winnipeg, Canada recently.

Do you know of 13 year old Chris "Kesz" Valdez who received a \$130,000 award for his work with abused and abandoned children who live on the streets and landfills of the Philippines? Archbishop Desmond Tutu presented the 2012 International Children's Peace Prize to Kesz at a ceremony in Hague in September. A severely abused child himself, Kesz ran away from home at 4 years old and lived homeless until a Christian group rescued him. Now, this young boy's mission is to reach out to other street kids and he has already helped more than 10,000 Filipino children.

Good news abounds, but often we are unaware of it. Unfortunately, the media bombards us with stories of tragedy, crime, war and injustice. Then to add insult to injury, the political machine peppers us with untruths, half-truths, sarcasm and ridicule as they attempt to convince us of a candidate's incompetence. Charity and love do not prevail in most political ads and the negativity can be disheartening and annoying, to say the least.

Yet, we are not powerless. Particularly in these pre-election days, if you are tired of bad news and negativity you might want to check out the Good News Network at <u>gnn@goodnewsnetwork.org</u>. Every week GNN publishes 10 true good-news stories; the two above were included in the September 24 edition. It's a free subscription too – that alone is good news!

Parenthetically, the word "gospel" means "good news." Christians typically think of the four Gospels existing only in the Bible. However, I once heard a Boston College professor say, "God didn't publish just once." The Gospel or "Good News" continues to be written in the lives of the bus driver, the Filipino boy, and so many more. Wouldn't it be great if their stories were proclaimed from pulpits! I can only imagine Jesus' pride in sharing the spotlight.

When we hear good news, our spirits are lifted and we are often inspired to *be* "good news" for someone else. Perhaps if all of us make the effort to at least balance our storytelling and story-listening with anecdotes that speak of one's character and greatness, we will not only be happier ourselves, but also create a better world.

Good news does truly abound. It's up to each of us to find it and then spread it. *Got news*?
