# Peg's Ponderings: To Thine Own Self Be True

Yesterday I saw "Promised Land," the newly released movie starring Matt Damon and Frances McDormand who play corporate sales partners at Global, a naturalgas company. Their job is to convince residents of a poor rural U.S. town that they will strike it rich if they allow Global to come in and drill their land. The problem is the mining method, hydraulic fracking, could lead to environmental devastation of the land and water. The well-intentioned sales duo find themselves in a moral dilemma and their integrity is at stake.

What is integrity? According to relationship author Pam Farrel, it's "a commitment to live consistently with what you know to be true about life." The motivational speaker and author Alan Cohen says, "You are in integrity when what you are doing on the outside matches who you are on the inside." Personally, I have great admiration for people of integrity. They can be trusted; they are honest; they have courage; and their actions do not depend on the approval of others.

The price of integrity can be high, however. Following one's conscience puts you at risk of ridicule and rejection. For example, Maryknoll priest of 40 years, Roy Bourgeois, was recently excommunicated by the Church, as well as dismissed from his religious order, because of his support of women becoming priests. When asked to recant his position he said he couldn't without betraying his conscience. "In essence you are asking me to lie and say I do not believe that God calls both men and women to the priesthood. This I cannot do." Whether one agrees with his views on priesthood or not, Ray Bourgeois is a man of integrity and his integrity cost him much.

"Promised Land" offers a timely plot for all of us to ponder. In both small and significant matters, each of us is challenged to live consistently with our beliefs and values, which is not always easy. Current issues are multi-faceted. Situations are sometimes ambiguous. Promised or imagined rewards can be tempting. But in spite of the complexity of life, what else is more important than being true to oneself and living with integrity? In the words of controversial former senator Alan Simpson, "If you have integrity, nothing else matters. If you don't have integrity, nothing else matters." I think he got it right on this one.

*Change.org* serves as a platform for social change. It allows anyone to create a petition that can make a difference in the lives of others. A petition is then circulated throughout a mailing list and receivers can then simply sign it or not. Change.org gives us the opportunity to stand up for justice and put our integrity to work. An example of a current petition is one for the Nobel Peace Prize nomination of Malala Yousafzai, the young teenage girl who was gunned down by the Taliban for seeking an education. A 2011 petition begun by a Rogers Williams College, RI graduate successfully got the Bank of America to drop a new monthly fee after 300,000 supporters signed it.
